 - The concept of culture is very complicated, and the word has many meanings. The word 'culture' is most commonly used in three ways.
 - Excellence of taste in the fine arts and humanities, also known as *high culture*.
 - An integrated pattern of human knowledge, belief, and behavior.
 - The outlook, attitudes, values, morals, goals, and customs shared by a society.

- *National cultures*
 - Cultures are what make countries unique. Each country has different cultural activities and cultural rituals. Culture includes material goods, the things the people use and produce. Culture is also the beliefs and values of the people and the ways they think about and understand the world and their own lives.

- Different countries have different cultures.
 - For example, some older Japanese people wear kimonos, arrange flowers in vases, and have tea ceremonies.
