


Hamburger paragraph



Parts of a Paragraph

Topic Sentence: This sentence tells the reader the main idea, or what the paragraph will be about.

Supporting Sentence One: This sentence gives specific details relating to the main idea.

Supporting Sentence Two: This sentence gives another specific detail relating to the main idea.

Supporting Sentence Three: This sentence gives more specific details relating to the main idea.

Concluding Sentence: This sentence refers to the topic sentence and sums up the main idea of the paragraph.

A concluding sentence

- -Indicates that you are bringing closure to a paragraph.
- -For each paragraph, the reader should be able to identify what your key points are based on the concluding sentence.
- -Remember, it <u>should not</u> include any information that was not discussed in the paragraph.

Characteristics of Effective Concluding Sentences

- -Reviewing main points mentioned in a paragraph
- -Restating the topic sentence
- -Are found at the end of a paragraph
- -Do not introduce new ideas or topics

A Topic sentence

After graduating from high school, many students go on to university, but their reasons for entering higher education vary. = controlling idea

Supporting points: 1 To study a particular subject in depth. 2 To prepare for a future career. 3 To make friends and enjoy an active social life.

Concluding sentence: To sum up, students go to university for a variety of reasons: to study a particular field, to find a good job, or to make friends.

The concluding sentence sometimes begins with:

In summary,
 In short, In conclusion,
 In brief,

As you can see,
 On the whole, That's why...



B Topic sentence

Some students go on to university for reasons other than academic study.

Supporting points: 1 To meet many people. 2 To enjoy sports and hobbies. 3 To find a better career in the future.

Concluding sentence: In short, some students go to university not to study but to socialize with other students, participate in club activities, or to find a good job.

C Topic sentence

After graduating from high school, many students go on to university because it will help them in their future career.

Supporting points: 1 They can obtain a university degree. 2 They can gain specialized knowledge. 3 They can learn practical skills.

Concluding sentence: To summarize, with their degree, specialized knowledge, and practical skills, university graduates have an advantage in the job market, and for some students, this is the main reason for attending university.
