

Writing exercise

Example

-where

1 The city is amazing. = The city where James visited last week is amazing.

2 Sara went to the city. Sara went to the city where James visited last week.

-This is a school. = This is a school where Tim studied French.

-The hospital was burnt.

= The hospital where my mother gave birth to me was burnt.

-Maki is the nice café.

= Maki is the nice café where Marina met her husband.

-The place is near. = The place where animals gather to drink is near.

Writing exercise

Example

-who

1 Your friend is selfish.

= Your friend who skipped the class yesterday is selfish.

2 I hate your friend.

= I hate your friend who always gossips about me.

-whom

1 The politician gave a speech in a park.

= The politician whom my mother admires gave a speech in a park

2 I met the politician.

= met the politician whom my friend dislikes.

EXAMPLE

-which

1 The notebook was stolen.

= The notebook which you borrowed was stolen.

2 I bought the notebook.

= I bought the notebook which was stolen yesterday.

-whose

1 The man is smiling.

= The man whose son won the prize is smiling.

2 Yesterday I met the man.

= Yesterday I met the man whose dog bit me 3 days ago .

Example

Prepositional phrase

1 The cake is delicious. The cake in that bakery is delicious.

2 I bought the cake. I bought the cake from that bakery.

3 The lecturer is quite upset. The lecturer in a seminar room is quite upset.

4 I met the lecturer. I met the lecturer at Siam Paragon.

5 You can borrow my book. You can borrow my book on a shelf.

6 The mobile phone is mine. The mobile phone in a bag is mine.

Infinitive phrase Jane has a dream to travel in Japan/around the world.

1 Jane has a dream. Jane has a dream to be the prime minister.

2 Her desire never comes true. Her desire to travel around the world never comes true.

Adjective clause

-where

1 The beach is beautiful.

2 I went to the beach.

-who

1 My sister is kind.

2 I love my sister.

-whom

1 The singer is playing in a concert.

2 I met the singer.

-which

1 The mobile phone belongs to James.

2 I lost the mobile phone.

-whose

1 The student is crying.

2 Yesterday I met the student.

1 The flowers are blooming.

2 I bought the flowers.

3 The staff is busy.
